

TARGET AUDIENCE

The program is designed for physicians and other healthcare professionals who practice in Level I-IV trauma centers including trauma surgeons, emergency physicians, trauma nurses, and trauma coordinators. Others who will benefit include other surgical specialists, family practice physicians and pediatricians, advance practice and critical care nurses, surgical residents, physician assistants, emergency medical service workers, and paramedics.

GOAL AND EDUCATIONAL NEED

The goal of the Arkansas Trauma Update is to provide practical education and training to enhance Arkansas healthcare providers' abilities in triage, treatment, and transport of acutely ill and injured patients. This endeavor is a result of the Arkansas Trauma System bill that was passed in Spring 2009. Arkansas is ranked among the lowest in the nation in the delivery of emergency medicine, making education of healthcare professionals in this area a high priority. In order to make the Trauma System successful, there must be highly qualified professionals on all levels working together to improve the morbidity and mortality rates for these patients.

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this activity the participants will be able to:

- Describe the role of the trauma surgeon during combat casualty care
- Describe the current status of the implementation of the Arkansas Trauma System
- Describe the key concepts in recognition and management of abdominal compartment syndrome and a variety of traumatic injuries including injuries of the hand, brain, liver, aorta, pelvis, and spinal cord
- List 2-3 important factors in managing pediatric trauma patients
- Recognize important issues for building a successful trauma system within Arkansas
- Discuss the protocols for massive transfusion in trauma patients
- Recognize the key concepts in focused abdominal sonography in trauma care
- Discuss current indications for and pitfalls of imaging of traumatic injuries of abdomen and pelvis
